<sup>11</sup> O Corinthians! We have spoken openly to you, our heart is wide open. <sup>12</sup> You are not restricted by us, but you are restricted by your *own* affections. <sup>13</sup> Now in return for the same (I speak as to children), you also be open.

<sup>14</sup> Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness? <sup>15</sup> And what accord has Christ with Belial? Or what part has a believer with an unbeliever? <sup>16</sup> And what agreement has the temple of God with idols?

*Says the LORD Almighty.”*

<sup>1</sup> *Therefore, having these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.*

Step 1: Read the following passage of scripture:	Step 2: List the Facts Verse by Verse:

2 Cor. 7:2-7

<sup>2</sup> *Open your hearts* to us. We have wronged no one, we have corrupted no one, we have cheated no one. <sup>3</sup> I do not say *this* to condemn; for I have said before that you are in our hearts, to die together and to live together. <sup>4</sup> Great *is* my boldness of speech toward you, great *is* my boasting on your behalf. I am filled with comfort. I am exceedingly joyful in all our tribulation. <sup>5</sup> For indeed, when we came to Macedonia, our bodies had no rest, but we were troubled on every side. Outside *were* conflicts, inside *were* fears. <sup>6</sup> Nevertheless God, who comforts the downcast, comforted us by the coming of Titus, <sup>7</sup> and not only by his coming, but also by the consolation with which he was comforted in you, when he told us of your earnest desire, your mourning, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced even more.

## Lesson Seventeen Day Four

Step 1: Read the following passage of scripture:	Step 2: List the Facts Verse by Verse:

2 Cor. 7:8-12

<sup>8</sup> For even if I made you sorry with my letter, I do not regret it; though I did regret it. For I perceive that the same epistle made you sorry, though only for a while. <sup>9</sup> Now I rejoice, not that you were made sorry, but that your sorrow led to repentance. For you were made sorry in a godly manner, that you might suffer loss from us in nothing. <sup>10</sup> For godly sorrow produces repentance *leading* to salvation, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death. <sup>11</sup> For observe this very thing, that you sorrowed in a godly manner: What diligence it produced in you, *what clearing of yourselves, what indignation, what fear, what vehement desire, what zeal, what vindication!* In all *things* you proved yourselves to be clear in this matter. <sup>12</sup> Therefore, although I wrote to you, *I did not do it* for the sake of him who had done the wrong, nor for the sake of him who suffered wrong, but that our care for you in the sight of God might appear to you.

<sup>13</sup> Therefore we have been comforted in your comfort. And we rejoiced exceedingly more for the joy of Titus, because his spirit has been refreshed by you all. <sup>14</sup> For if in anything I have boasted to him about you, I am not ashamed. But as we spoke all things to you in truth, even so our boasting to Titus was found true. <sup>15</sup> And his affections are greater for you as he remembers the obedience of you all, how with fear and trembling you received him. <sup>16</sup> Therefore I rejoice that I have confidence in you in everything.
